It Is Never too Late

We humans are peculiar, are we not? No matter how well things are going, we are always on the lookout for someone who might be getting a better deal. And, life being what it is, it probably doesn't take long to find. So it is with the laborers in today's Gospel. Each is paid a fair wage, and is glad to have the work, but seeing others get paid as well for less work causes them consternation. Through our baptism, we are perhaps most like the first hires in the parable, but we risk falling into believing that because we are Christian we *deserve* to go to heaven.

It is Jesus alone who offers us the reward of heaven, not through our merits, but through His Sacrifice on the Cross. That He does so, especially in spite of our failings, is completely unmerited, and yet such is His boundless love for us.

I recall the story of a woman who converted to Catholicism from atheism. As she prepared to be received into the Church, she wrote about anticipating her first confession. She was not especially worried about it, figuring that was then and this was now. It was only when she was actually in the confessional that she confronted her earlier sinfulness in a flood of unexpected tears. She experienced profound regret for all the time lost without Jesus, for all her foolish decisions, for allowing herself to reject Him, even when she didn't really know Him.

In a homily last week, Pope Francis said,

“...the ability to acknowledge our own sins, to acknowledge our misery, to acknowledge what we are and what we are capable of doing or have done is the very door that opens us to the Lord's caress, His forgiveness.”

When we think about it, perhaps we are less like the workers who labored all day and more like the ones who arrived mid-day or at the end of the day. Even among Christians, we do not always live as we should and can probably recall some time lost without Jesus in our lives. Our conversion may not be a dramatic one, only gradual, but every day we are faced with the choice to “turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel.”

The parable today teaches us that it is never too late. Jesus invites us to come to Him throughout our lives, just as the landowner calls out to the laborers throughout the day. Whether we answer His call at dawn or at dusk, may we always be truly grateful for Jesus' promise of our eternal reward with Him in heaven.
