
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

THOSE WHO DO WHAT IS TRUE COME TO THE LIGHT

Many Catholics experience some reticence over the Sacrament of Confession. Today it is more often called Penance and Reconciliation, reflecting different aspects of the sacrament, and perhaps different pastoral emphases over the years. *Reconciliation*, however, seems most apt, as that is its purpose and effect. Catholic writer Joseph D. White describes the Sacrament of Reconciliation as "a tangible sign of God's desire to reach out to us throughout our lives, even in our sinfulness, and help us reconcile ourselves with him and with [others]."

God has reached out to us, invited us to have a heart-to-heart, to renew our relationship with Him. He already knows all the hows and whys of our having fallen short and His forgiveness is there, waiting for us in the confessional, if only we have the humility to acknowledge our sins and accept it.

A good confession begins well before we approach the priest in the confessional. We should start by taking an honest account of ourselves by making an "examination of conscience." There are many helpful examples online to guide us or we can read through the Ten Commandments or Beatitudes, reflecting on how we apply them to our lives and the choices we make. Perhaps we think that we do our best and that, although not perfect, we are not "sinners." If we look a little deeper, however, most of us tend to fall into certain patterns of sin, having a particular weakness for one or more of the "seven deadly sins": pride, greed, anger, lust, gluttony, jealousy, and sloth. We struggle sometimes throughout our lives to master them and it hurts to return to confession and admit defeat time and again. Other times, we've had an epic fail, and wince at the very thought of it. Examining our conscience might uncover things we would rather not see, but as Jesus says in today's Gospel,

"...The light has come into the world, and people loved darkness rather than light because their deeds were evil. For all who do evil hate the light and do not come to the light, so that their deeds may not be exposed. But those who do what is true come to the light, so that it may be clearly seen that their deeds have been done in God." *Jn 3:19-21*

Turning that light on ourselves is necessary for our ongoing conversion. Once we face our sinfulness headon and have remorse and a desire to turn away from darkness and live in the light of Christ, we are ready to make our confession. The priest is there, *in persona Christi*, to help us and to give us absolution. Let us put our trust in Jesus and accept His beautiful gift of forgiveness and renewal.

Please join us on Wednesday evening at 7:15 for our Parish Lenten Reconciliation Service. Several priests will be present to hear individual confessions.
