FOCUS

Jesus promises that those who believe and follow him will never die. Today's Gospel (John 11: 1-45) recounts Jesus saying, *I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live*. These words clearly identify Jesus as the Son of God, the author of life and the one who brings our salvation. The words also give the promise and hope of eternal life in heaven to all who believe in him and persevere in faith.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

In the reading from Ezekiel, the prophet tells the Israelites that they will know God because he gives them life and frees them from enslavement. Saint Paul explains to the Romans that the life-giving spirit they received through Christ frees them from both sin and death. In the Gospel reading, Jesus proclaims that he is the resurrection and the life and that all who live and believe in him will never die.
