# Hail Mary, Gentle Woman

During the month of May, it is good to spend some time in prayer with Mary. Two depictions of the Annunciation can help us gain a deeper understanding of the importance of Mary's role in salvation history.



The first has the angel Gabriel bowing before Mary. The joint humility of the angel at the feet of Mary, who is herself kneeling before God in prayer, reflects the awesomeness of the event. Both are aware of the cosmic importance of this quiet exchange. Both appreciate that they are participating in God's wonderful plan and that the world will never be the same.

The second image depicts both characters standing; it naturally follows the scene just described. Here Mary and Gabriel are facing each other, seemingly engaged in a dance. There is an

aura of celebration, of pure joy as both characters have a full understanding of what has transpired. Salvation history is fulfilled! God's promised Messiah has taken human form! The eternal has entered the temporal and Mary and Gabriel rejoice.

Meditating on the mysteries of the rosary not only deepens our prayer life but can lead to greater theological understanding. Mary, being born without the stain of sin, was in no need of the Word Incarnate – the Word, the Son of God, yes, but not Jesus the Son of Man. Mary, being perfectly conformed to the image of God, gained nothing from His Incarnation: she was already assured her place in Heaven. Nor would she have jeopardized that place by refusing to be the Mother of God: she would have remained without sin. Her Fiat, an absolute act of free will, was also an act of absolute selflessness. Her unfailing love of God and of others fueled this act. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life" (Jn 3:16). The same is true of Mary, the Mother of God, Queen of Heaven and Earth.

Mary is our Mother of Faith just as Abraham is our Father of Faith. Both were asked to sacrifice their only child, their son. Both said yes unconditionally. Both trusted in God's goodness and in His desire for all of creation. This is true of the sacrifices we make daily, great or small. This is especially true when we suffer loss, through sickness, addiction, death... If we place ourselves in Christ's wounded hands, trusting in His plan, we sustain Mary's 'yes' as it resounds throughout history.

Mary is our dearest prayer companion as she has full knowledge of Jesus, Who was made flesh in her womb. She accompanied her Son throughout His joy and His suffering on Earth and never failed Him. It is therefore beneficial to spend some time with Mary every day, contemplating the mysteries of God through the rosary, either alone or with family or friends. Mary is our sure guide to a deeper devotion to Jesus.
