DONATE YOUR BACKPACKS!!! CarePacks MTL





In Flanders fields.


Take up our quarrel with the foe:

What they didn't know was that I, too, was battling intense fear and anxiety in my own life. So, we did the only thing we knew to do that day; we declared peace over ourselves. We knew that if we could sing God's promises over ourselves it would drown out the fear and would shift things inside of us. That's what some of the bridesmaids in today's parable were like. They only brought enough oil for their lamps, and didn't bother to bring any extra.



SANCTUARY LAMP


The Sanctuary Lamp signals the Presence of the Lord Jesus in the
