

A WORD FROM THE PILLARS TRUST FUND: Our condolences to those of you who may have lost a loved one during this pandemic. We pray for the safety and well-being of all our donors and friends. Despite all upsets, we at Pillars Trust listened to the community and we were quick to react to COVID-19. We were there for several parish initiatives and for parishes which started live streaming to spread the Good News to their parishioners. We gave several grants for spiritual programs as well as grants to purchase audio-visual equipment. Our ongoing financial commitments remain: The Newman Center at McGill University, the home for spiritual and intellectual life at McGill; The Ignatian Centre, dedicated to bringing the Spiritual Exercises

of St. Ignatius of Loyola to the population of greater Montreal; The Diocesan Priesthood Guild of Montreal which financially supports seminarians; Camp Caritas, a dynamic youth sports camp with a difference; Parish Vitality, spearheaded by Terrel Joseph to improve parish life; The English Speaking Catholic Council, which advocates for Catholic values in society and to our governments. All the above are supported by the Pillars Trust Fund, and despite the challenges of the pandemic, all of these groups are energized and continue to help our community. Pillars Trust will not allow the pandemic to hurt our spirit or to stop making Montreal a caring community, so we are sharing good news. We are proud to be working with the Nazareth Community in a major project this year. The Nazareth Community provides a home for those who would otherwise be homeless. We are matching donations (up to \$75,000) made to the Nazareth Community for the purchase and renovation of John's House, a new residence for young Montreal men, who without this home would be living on the street, struggling with mental illness and/or addiction. John's House will be opening in November and is named after the late Fr. John Emmett Walsh. So again this year we say thank you to our donors. We literally couldn't do all these things without you. 



Week 2

The Candle of Peace for Advent

The peace of God allows us to look at others through heaven's eyes and help guide the world to see God's here and not-yet here kingdom. Peace from God, biblical peace, allows us to trust in God's promises (*Proverbs 3:5*), through restful, tranquil faith, despite the dark, scary world around us.

What Is the Candle of Peace?

One of the hallmarks of the Christmas story is when the angels appear to the shepherds and proclaim, "Peace on earth," in (*Luke 2:14*). Jesus brought about peace, in the most unexpected ways, when he arrived. The Jews, particularly the zealots, wanted a rebellion. They wanted their Savior to overturn the oppressive rule of the Romans and bring about peace in a violent way. But Jesus had

something else in mind. Jesus brings us peace in a number of ways. First, he gives us inner peace. Because of his work on the cross, we have a chance to receive salvation and be indwelled by the Holy Spirit. This grants us an inner peace *John 14:27*. Not only do we have the peace that comes from our assurance of salvation, but we also have the peace of mind knowing God will heal this broken world and will come again.

Second, we have peace with others. We put aside our differences *Galatians 3:28*, especially with other believers, because we belong to the same family. We have the same purpose: to let others know about the peace of Christ. The Hebrew word for peace: *Shalom*, goes far beyond not fighting with others or peace as we know it. Shalom is, in essence, how things are meant to be: a slice of heaven. The peace of God allows us to look at others through heaven's eyes and help guide the world to see God's here and not-yet here kingdom. Peace from God, biblical peace, allows us to <u>trust in God's promises</u> *Proverbs 3:5*, through restful, tranquil faith, despite the dark, scary world around us.

What Does the **Bible** Say about Peace?

Not surprisingly, the Bible has a lot to say about peace, as it attributes peace to Jesus himself: the Prince of Peace *Isaiah 9:6.*In fact, the word peace appears somewhere between 200-400 times in the Bible.In addition to the items listed above, biblical peace:

- Guards our hearts from the devil *Philippians 4:7*
- **Brings us joy** *Proverbs* 12:20
- Is a blessing from God Psalm 29:11
- Assists us during dire circumstances Isaiah 54:10

The peace of God grants us a tranquility you cannot find anywhere else and offers a light to others who do not yet know that peace.

Why Does This Matter?

We live in an eye-for-an-eye, revenge culture. We also live in scary times. But the peace of God transcends our circumstances and world. With this, we can be rest assured that he will come and make everything right once

more.Our peace can also stir the curiosity of those who do not believe in Christ. They will see us exercise a spirit of tranquility, faith, and they will want to know the reason for our faith in shaky times.

When they ask, we can have a reason at the ready. "I am not afraid because I have the peace of Christ."





Heavenly Father, You are the God who gives peace. This second week of Advent causes us to remember that because of Jesus we can experience a Christmas free from turmoil and chaos. Regardless of our circumstances or our situations, you offer us peace that passes understanding. That first Christmas, when you sent your Son, you sent the one who is called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, and Prince of Peace. Even the angels cried out, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests." The angels knew your purpose. They know the gifts of hope, peace, joy, and love that Christmas held. They recognized that the fullness of God was wrapped in the tiny flesh of an infant as you humbled yourself and dwelt among us. Emmanuel. God with us as the baby Jesus.

Father, this second week of Advent, keep us in perfect peace as our mind is stayed on the truth of your powerful love. Thank you for your mighty, sovereign hand. Help us to trust fully in you and rest in the peace that you offer. It's in the precious name of Jesus we pray. Amen.






