Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

It is love that has explained everything to me

In today's Gospel, Jesus draws us to the very heart of God, Who is Love. Love is more than a feeling. It is a sharing in divine life, a gift intrinsic to our very being, bestowed upon us when God knit us in our mother's womb. We are called to live the love of God and neighbor as He does: "with all our heart, with all our mind and with all our soul." A recent example of living this commandment to the full can be found in St. John Paul the Second, whose feast day the Church celebrated last Wednesday.

It is his profound surrender to Love that enabled this pope, then a young priest Karol Wojtyla, to confess: "It is love that has explained everything to me." What a radical way to live! In St. John Paul, there is no deception, no hypocrisy. He lived his life in harmony with Love, conformed to the image and likeness of God, through Whom he was created. Being conformed to the hand of Christ, he could share in His humility and follow Jesus' more difficult teachings:

Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you. For if you love those who love you, what reward do you have? Be merciful, therefore, as your heavenly Father is merciful. (cf. Mt 6: 44, 46, 48)

At the Heart of Jesus lies mercy and forgiveness. This is what poured out of His side as He hung on the cross. Love made Him cry out: "Forgive them Father for they know not what they do." He calls on us to do the same, to shower those who hurt us with His merciful Love. In this way, we will be made perfect, fulfilling the greatest commandment in humility and gentility.

Jesus even provides practical help on how to love our enemy: "Pray for those who persecute you." In our daily lives, persecution takes on the form of rude emails from co-workers and clients, finding an empty milk carton in the fridge or being cut off for the third time while driving the kids to school. A quick prayer, commending the offender and ourselves to the Lord's care, will always improve our subsequent response. Prayer is a means of love.

As we come to receive the fullness of Christ today in the Holy Eucharist, let us open our hearts, minds and souls to His tender mercy so that we too may exclaim: "It is love that has explained everything to me."
