Communicating with the Dead 101

There is a popular reality television show which features a "medium," a woman who claims to have a psychic connection with deceased people. She runs into people at the grocery store or hairdresser, as well as at organized events, and in no time she is talking it up with their departed loved ones. It's always good news. No matter the circumstances of their life and death, no matter the kind of relationship they had with the people who remain, it's always good. They are happy and at peace. They want their families to relax and be happy and not to worry about them. It's all good.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* says we must reject all forms of divination, including "recourse to mediums" (CCC, 2116), which are psychics who channel spirits of the dead in order to get information. This is extremely dangerous. Channelling is when the medium invokes spirits and allows them to use their body and voice to speak. These spirits may appear to be of God but they are not.

We might ask, what harm does it do, if it makes someone feel better? Many, perhaps most, psychics are simply frauds. They will fleece their clients for large sums of money and offer them nothing but a show. But beyond the financial harm they do, they cause great spiritual harm because of their false assurances. Our loved ones need our prayers and it is our duty to pray for them and to have Masses offered for them. So, at the least, if we are convinced that our loved one is "at peace," in heaven, then we are not likely to pray for them. It is a disservice to our loved ones and it contributes to our own alienation from our loving God.

Even more disturbing are those mediums who actually do channel spirits. Good spirits – the saints in heaven – are reached through prayers of intercession. We are part of the Communion of Saints and we share our love for Christ and each other. We are connected in a special way, forming the Mystical Body of Christ. We do not have a connection to bad spirits, unless we invite them. That is the role of the medium. They channel spirits that say positive things, reassuring things – how else would people be drawn in? But these are lies that encourage people to put their trust and confidence where it does not belong; they gradually draw them away from their faith and trust in God.

Today, as we celebrate All Souls Day, let us pray for our loved ones and for all the souls in purgatory. They are counting on us - as we will count on those who follow us. Those who are already at peace in heaven will join us in these prayers. They are never wasted and always needed.
