#### THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

**Theme:** The Greatest Commandment - "Love". **Breaking Open the Word** 

Suggested text for faith sharing: Today's Gospel: Mt 22: 34-40 Step One: Listen to the Word

As you listen once again to this familiar teaching of Jesus, what caught your ear in it today? What line or word from the reading lingers in your memory

#### Step Two: Look into Your Life

**Question for Children:** We show our love for Jesus by loving our friends and family. Share one way that you show your love. **Question for Youth:** Jesus tells us that we are to love others as we love ourselves. Do you love yourself? Can you see the good that God has put within you? Do you find it easier to love others or yourself?

**Question for Adults:** Repeat the two commandments which Jesus teaches today in your own words? For each of them, share how it has become part of your life.
