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

Divine Communication with Us

The second reading from the letter to the Hebrews for Christmas Mass during the Day (1:1-6) opens with a reflection on the climax of God's revelation to the human race in his Son. The divine communication was initiated and maintained during the times of the Old Testament in fragmentary and varied ways through the prophets. But now in these last days (1:2), the final age, God's revelation of his saving purpose is achieved through a son, i.e., one who is Son, whose role is redeemer and mediator of creation. He was made heir of all things through his death and exaltation to glory, yet he existed before he appeared as man; through him God created the universe. The once-humiliated and crucified Jesus has been declared God's Son, and this name shows his superiority even to the angels.

Divine camping in our midst

John's Prologue (1:1-18) states the main themes of the fourth gospel: life, light, truth, the world, testimony, and the preexistence of Jesus Christ, the incarnate *Logos*, who reveals God the Father. In origin, the Prologue was probably an early Christian hymn. Its closest parallel is in other Christological hymns, Colossians 1:15-20 and Philippians 2:6-11. Its core is poetic in structure, with short phrases linked by "staircase parallelism," in which the last word of one phrase becomes the first word of the next.

"In the beginning" evokes the first words of the Old Testament (Genesis 1:1). The Word (Greek logos) combines God's dynamic, creative word (Genesis), personified pre-existent Wisdom as the instrument of God's creative activity (Proverbs), and the ultimate intelligibility of reality (Hellenistic philosophy). The Prologue climaxes with the announcement: "The Word became flesh and dwelt among us" (1:14) (in Greek literally: "pitched his tent among us"). It's a form of divine camping in our midst! This presence came about through the free love of God: "In this way the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world that we might live through him" (1 John 4:9). The Word is not simply a message that we can put into words. In Jesus, the message and the messenger are united. The medium is indeed the message!
