Wouldn't it be great if you could attend a retreat for a few minutes a day in the comfort of your own home? The Parish Lenten retreat is exactly that:



Step Two: Look into your Life

Question for Youth: How do you feel when Jesus says that YOU are the salt of the earth and that YOU are called to be the light for others? Question for Adults: What specific efforts do you take to maintain your light? Do you let your light dim? Why?
