PRAYER TO SAINT JOSEPH TO KNOW ONE'S VOCATION

O Great Saint Joseph, you were completely obedient to the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Obtain for me the grace to know the state of life that God in His providence has chosen for me. Wouldn't it be great if you could attend a retreat for a few minutes a day in the comfort of your own home? The **Parish Lenten Retreat** is exactly that: a retreat that takes place mostly at your own home. Over the six weeks of Lent, participants will be paired up with a trained prayer companion. A Call to Care for the Sick

Pope Francis' message for the World Day of the Sick 2017 (Feb. 11) reminds us to remember in a special way the sick and dying. The following is an excerpt from his message:

Like St. Bernadette, we stand beneath the watchful gaze of Mary the humble maiden of Lourdes tells us that the Virgin, whom she called "the Lovely Lady," looked at her as one person looks at another. Those simple words describe the fullness of a relationship. Bernadette, poor, illiterate and ill, felt that Mary was looking at her as a person. The Lovely Lady spoke to her with great respect and without condescension. This reminds us that every person is. and always remains, a human being, and is to be treated as such. The sick and those who are disabled, even severely, have their own inalienable dignity and mission in life they never become simply objects. If at times they appear merely passive, in reality that is never the case...

Theme: God's Commandments are a way of life.

Breaking Open the Word Suggested text for faith sharing: Today's Gospel Reading Matthew 5: 38-48 **Step One: Listen to the Word** When you hear the word commandment, what do you feel? What did Jesus mean when he said he did not come to *abolish* but to *fulfill* the law of the prophets? **Step Two: Lock into your Life**

Step Two: Look into your Life

Question for Children: Which rules cause you the most difficulty? Why?

Question for Youth: In your own words, describe what the spirit of God's law is.

Question for Adults: Have you considered that laws are made with love? Do you accept God's love through his laws?
