

<u>FOCUS</u>: The season of Lent calls us to humility, to an honest understanding of who we are.

Humility is not false modesty, but the awareness of who we are: Sons and daughters of God, created by God. Yet we, like Adam and Eve, are often tempted to think of ourselves as more than creatures, as in control of the world. May God give us the grace to allow him to be God.

<u>LITURGY OF THE WORD</u> In the first reading, the woman and her husband eat fruit from the tree of life, and realize they are naked. In the Letter to the Romans, Paul reassures us that God's grace surpasses any of our sins. In the Gospel, the devil tempts Jesus while he is in the desert, but Jesus says to him, *Get away, Satan*! and the devil leaves him.

Theme: Temptation - What would Jesus do?

Breaking Open the Word

Suggested text for faith sharing: Today's Gospel:Matthew 4:1-11

Step One: Listen to the Word

As you listen to the familiar story of Jesus' journey into the desert, what word or phrase did you notice? As you heard it again today, what image from this story lingers in your memory?

Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question for Children: What do you plan to do during Lent this year as a way of showing you want to grow closer to Jesus?

Question for Youth: Jesus was tempted by the devil. How are you tempted? What helps you resist these temptations? **Question for Adults:** When you yourself pause to be alone with God, what distracts and prevents you from dwelling in that? Busyness? The demands of life? TV? The internet?

Like John the Baptist, we are each meant to prepare the way for the Lord, each in our own way and together as a community. Our three traditional Lenten practices – fasting, praying and almsgiving – help purify our souls, making a welcome home for the Holy Spirit.



RECONCILIATION SERVICE: Wednesday March 18th at 7:15 pm

Open to all. Come support the children who will be making their first confession! After a short Liturgy of the Word, several priests will be available to hear your confession. Been a while since your last confession? A little nervous? Don't let that stop you from receiving

God's love through this sacrament! A step by step guide through confession is available on the communion rail.

GET YOUR BUCKET Lenten buckets are available again this year. If you are fasting (ex. not eating sweets) or making some other sacrifice during Lent (ex. skipping your favorite television program), take a bucket from the communion rail home with you this Lent (one bucket per household please). We invite you to put the money you save because of your sacrifice into the bucket. Return your bucket to the parish office at Easter. In previous years, the money has gone to local families in need. RATHER NOT TAKE A BUCKET HOME? You can still contribute by throwing your contribution into our big blue bucket TAKE ST JOSEPH HOME! As part of this year's vocation theme, we invite parishioners to pray for vocations in their home with a small statue of St. Joseph, provided by the parish. 
