IT'S WHAT WE DO: You are what you eat. Or in this case, what you don't eat. Religious identity is often determined by the nature of your nurture. Observant Jews eat only kosher. Muslims eat nothing until after sunset during Ramadan. Catholics fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday and abstain from eating meat on Fridays during Lent. It's a sign of who we are, people who are hungry for the presence of Christ, the Bread of Life. We practice self-denial for the sake of the Kingdom. So on Fridays go meatless. It's what Catholics do.

Remember: (1) Ash Wednesday is a fast day – as is Good Friday. What do Roman Catholics mean by fasting? Two small meals and one regular sized meal – no snacking! (2) Traditionally, Catholics go meatless on Fridays! Try having Fish Fridays during Lent (3) Every Sunday we celebrate the resurrection by breaking our fast.

Last week's blurb made it sound that Ash Wednesday is holy day of obligation. It is Not! Sorry for any confusion caused. That being said, it does mark the first day of the most important season for many Christians. Please consider attending one of the two celebrations planned – see details below.

Are you going to be away for Ash Wednesday? This year Ash Wednesday falls on spring break for many of us. Many will be out of town and unable to attend Mass. What can you do to mark the day? Read over the readings (which can be found at <http://www.usccb.org/bible/readings/030619.cfm>), choose one reading to meditate on, and, if you are with family or friends, discuss.

HOW ARE YOU GOING TO CELEBRATE LENT WITH YOUR PARISH FAMILY? As we saw in last week's blurb, community is essential to Christian living. Please consider participating in a few of the following activities over the Lenten season.



Ash Wednesday is this Wednesday, March 6. Mass will be held at 8:30 am and at 7 pm. Ashes will be distributed at both Masses.

We will have our traditional **Pancake Supper** on Tuesday March 5, beginning at 5:30 pm in the parish hall – please enter by 71 Roosevelt. Stop by when you can for pancakes and sausages. Service ends at 7:30 pm. Admission: non-perishable food items for Multicaf, which can be left in the big wooden bin at 71 Roosevelt. **KITCHEN HELP WANTED:** Thank you to everyone coming to help flip pancakes! We will also need help to clean up afterwards.



Join us for the **Way of the Cross** at 3:30 pm on Fridays during Lent, before the 4 pm Mass.

Lenten buckets will be available again this year. If you are fasting (ex. not eating sweets) or making some other sacrifice during Lent (ex. skipping your favorite television program), take a bucket from the communion rail home with you this Lent (one bucket per household please). We invite you to put the money you save because of your sacrifice into the bucket. Return your bucket to the parish office at Easter. In previous years, the money has gone to local families in need.



MEDITATION group returns for **6 Lenten sessions!** Come to one or all six! Beginning Wednesday March 13 at 7:30 pm, following the 7 pm Mass.

Christ is most present to us in the Eucharist. Plan to spend some time with him before the blessed sacrament. We will have **ADORATION** on a Saturday morning during Lent. Please plan on stopping by, even if only for 10 minutes. All are welcome!



Our **RECONCILIATION SERVICE** will be held during Lent as well. Several priests will be available to hear your confession. One recent participant shared that she had come into the service with a heavy heart, feeling very troubled and overburdened, and that going to confession freed her of the weight she had been carrying. Are you a little apprehensive? Materials will be made available to help you make the most of this sacrament of healing.

AFTER SACRIFICE COMES CELEBRATION! After the Easter Vigil, the Mother of all Masses, please join us in the parish hall to we break our fast at our traditional **resurrection party!**

Fundscrip forms are available this weekend. Fundscrip is a passive form of fundraising. You buy gift cards to your favorite stores and the parish receives 2 to 7 % of your purchase, at no cost to you! For example you order \$100 from Provigo. You receive a \$100 gift card; the parish receives \$3.
