#### GOD'S LOVE FOR US IS LIMITLESS:

Today, we hear the familiar passage from Saint Paul when he says, *If God is for us, who can be against us*? Since we have been called by name, by virtue of our baptism, we know that we are God's children; we are his instruments in the world.

In the first reading, Abraham is willing to make the ultimate sacrifice of surrendering his son to the Lord. Saint Paul reminds the Romans that having God with them will allow them to face any challenge. In the Gospel, the disciples realize that Jesus is the fulfillment of the law after he is transfigured before them.

**Theme:** Seeing Jesus

### **Breaking Open the Word**

Suggested text for faith sharing: Today's Gospel. Mark 9: 2-10.

### **Step One: Listen to the Word**

As you hear this familiar story today, what words or phrases strike you? What in this reading touches your heart? What image from Mark's Gospel lingers in your memory?


Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question for Children: Name or draw a picture of a time you knew that Jesus was with you.

**Question for Youth:** The disciples had a very intense experience of Jesus on the mountain. Have you ever had a "mountain top" experience? What was it like for you?

Question for Adults: In what ways does Jesus speak today, ways in which you can truly "listen to him?"





Why do we pray the **STATIONS OF THE CROSS?** As a means of making sense of suffering. The question of why suffering exists finds its answer in Christ's transformation of suffering through love. Christ's cross makes sense of our own, hence the universal appeal of this devotion. The reality of suffering makes meditation on the passion and death of Jesus particularly relevant in Christian life. "If you really want to love Jesus, first learn to suffer, because suffering teaches you to love" (St. Gemma Galgani). How do we know if we are suffering well? If we remain joyful throughout our suffering. **Every Friday during Lent, join us at 8 am** as we pray the Stations of the Cross together. Readers and Crucifix bearers needed! Signup sheet available on the communion rail.

**GRAB A BUCKET PLEASE!** Only three remain! If you are fasting (ex. not eating sweets) or making some other sacrifice during Lent (ex. skipping your favorite program), take a bucket from the communion rail home with you (one bucket per household please).
