FEEDBACK - SYNOD ON THE PROTECTION OF MINORS: As an institution, the Church is well past the point of discussion and in need of a deliberate and concrete overhaul in order to weed out the insidious corruption that has been cultivated for centuries. Archbishop Lionel Gendron, president of the CCCB and Bishop of Longueuil, came out of the Synod with a dramatically changed viewpoint. He admitted that in cases of sexual abuse by clergy, his first concern was always for the priesthood, and then for victims. He now claims that his only concern is for victims. Having spoken with a mother whose son was abused, he realized that such conversations are discouraged, especially if trials are ongoing. This policy intrinsically favors the abuser within the Church, as he faces no restrictions on communication. As Father Robert pointed out in his homily last week, it is time for the Church to take an active role in HOW we make changes to the system. And like everything else in our faith, it is a movement from the bottom up. Jesus was grassroots: he literally hit the pavement, he listened and responded to individuals on a personal level. It is now our time to do the same. According to his last letter to the parish, our Archbishop Christian Lépine is looking forward to meeting with us. **TAKE SOME TIME THIS LENT** to pray about what concrete changes need to be made in the formation of potential priests, and what sort of evaluation process can be implemented on a regular basis to ensure the mental and physical health of the priesthood and their congregations. Below you will find many ways this parish family is coming together to worship, building a strong foundation from which to implement change. Please consider adding one or two of these Lenten activities to your to do list. ARE YOU GOING TO CELEBRATE LENT WITH YOUR PARISH FAMILY? Please consider participating in a few of the following activities over the Lenten season:



Join us for the **Way of the Cross** at 3:30 pm on Fridays during Lent, before the 4 pm Mass. A signup sheet is available near the icon of Mary for Crucifix bearers and readers.



Lenten buckets are available again this year. If you are fasting (ex. not eating sweets) or making some other sacrifice during Lent (ex. skipping your favorite television program), take a bucket from the communion rail or at the main doors of the church home with you this Lent (one bucket per household please). We invite you to put the money you save because of your sacrifice into the bucket. Return your bucket to the parish office at Easter. In previous years, the money has gone to local families in need.

Our **MEDITATION** group returns this Wednesday March 13 at 7:30 pm, following the 7 pm Mass. What is meditation? It is sitting quietly together with fellow parishioners, as you repeat silently, *Maranatha*, or *Come Lord Jesus*, to yourself. The point of the exercise is to find your centre in Jesus! This ancient form of prayer is practiced worldwide. Why not give it a try? Sessions last 30 to 40 minutes.



Christ is most present to us in the Eucharist. Plan to spend some time with him before the Blessed Sacrament. We will have **ADORATION** on a Saturday morning during Lent. Details to come.

Perhaps the Lord is calling you to make time for confession this Lent, perhaps for the first time in many years. A priest gave us his number one tip for confession at a retreat I attended last weekend: just chill out. And come. Jesus is waiting for you. 
