FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

LOVE IS THE SOURCE OF TRUE FREEDOM: Last month, we looked at the Scriptures through the lens of the recent scandals that have rocked the Church. One of the fruits of this reflection was to take a step back and recall the history of salvation that is still at work, remembering that Jesus is still with us even now, bringing healing and reconciliation.

...Announcing the Good News, sharing with others God's gracious offer of salvation, is not primarily about the words we use: it is about the way we live our lives, and the way we live together as a community of faith and reconciliation in the world. And that is what a gospel-inspired response to scandal looks like! _

DO NOT BE AFRAID: Jesus is always drawing us out of our comfort zone and more deeply into his perfect love, so that we may go out into the world, fully confident of being loved. We experienced this at our international potluck last Saturday. One participant remarked that she has been at a similar event at another parish but that there was music and dancing, decorations, etc... But we are not like that. We had no music or dancing; there was a complete lack of anything decorative. The kids were playing soccer in the middle of the hall as the adults were chatted, enjoying each other's company. At about 8:30 pm, everyone got up, tidied up and went our separate ways... This is what it means to be part of this parish family. 'We are not like that' and that is ok. This is our way of being a loving presence to each other. And that is just fine, with us and with God!

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE SICK: This weekend, following each Mass, Father Robert will be available to administer the Anointing of the Sick. Formerly known as Last Rites, this sacrament helps unite those who are suffering with Jesus' saving and healing power. Suffering is a part of life, but Jesus unites our suffering with his passion and death so that through our suffering we can participate in his saving and healing work. The sacrament also reminds us that God wants to give comfort to the suffering and wants us to relieve suffering where we can. Anyone who is seriously ill or in danger of death is eligible to receive this sacrament.
