“Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did it to me.”

In today's gospel, Jesus makes very clear our responsibility to care for “the least” of our brothers and sisters. With Advent and Christmas approaching, the pastoral staff has been considering ways in which Our Lady of the Annunciation Parish can respond to those in need in our community. Through our “Helping Others” collections, we contribute to parishes and organizations that prepare Christmas baskets for families and individuals in impoverished areas of the city. Those who attend the Advent/Christmas Supper also donate gifts that are distributed by the Saint Vincent de Paul Society. Still, within our own community, there are those who are in need and we wanted to reach out to them in a special way.

This year, we have undertaken to bring a little Christmas to the vulnerable, frail and often lonely people who reside at Vigi Mont-Royal, a long-term care residence on Brittany Avenue. Beginning next Sunday, we will place an Advent Angel Tree in the sanctuary, and of course, we are counting on the generosity of our parishioners to make this project a success.

The Advent Angel Tree is an opportunity to bring the love of Christ to these “least” of our community during the Christmas season. The tree is decorated with cards, each with a suggested gift item for a resident. Parishioners are invited to take as many cards as they would like from the tree and to purchase the suggested gifts. Gifts should be returned in a gift bag with the card from the tree attached as a gift tag and placed under the tree. We ask that all gifts be dropped off no later than the Third Sunday of Advent, December 14th.

If you are unable to shop but would like to support this project, cash donations will also be accepted, and our parish elves will do the rest. Thank you in advance for your kindness.
